
ID Theft Central is your online resource for reporting identity theft crimes

Reporting a crime at ID Theft Central will get your report to law enforcement, and will provide you with helpful tips to recover from the damage caused by the crime. After you have submitted your report at ID Theft Central, you are provided an identity theft affidavit and an incident report that may be used by creditors, banks, credit reporting agencies and others to help clear your name and credit history. Incidents of identity theft reported at ID Theft Central help law enforcement investigate crimes, identify patterns of fraud, and may help stop an identity thief.

Repair

ID Theft Central provides information to assist individuals who are victims or suspect

they may be victims of identity theft. It is intended as a general guide of steps needed to resolve the problems created by identity theft.



Steps to Clear ID Theft

Organize your case

Organize your case by documenting and keeping track of people, financial accounts, and organizations that are helping you resolve the theft of your identity.

Fraudulent Credit Accounts created with your Identity

Contact the financial institution or business where the fraudulent accounts were created to let them know you are victim of identity theft. A Police report and affidavit that includes information about your situation will help clear fraudulent accounts. Be sure to close all affected accounts.

Initiate a Credit Freeze or Fraud Alert

Contact the three credit reporting agencies (Equifax, Experian, TransUnion) and place a Credit Freeze or Fraud Alert on your credit account to protect your credit information.

Report the theft to the Police

Report your identity theft incident at ID Theft Central or to your local law enforcement agency. Make sure you are provided a case number. Financial institutions and creditors often require a case number to clear your name.

Review your Credit Report and Financial Statements

Review your financial statements and credit reports regularly. Identify any new accounts or request for credit that you did not initiate. Contact the credit reporting agency or financial institution concerning any discrepancies.
